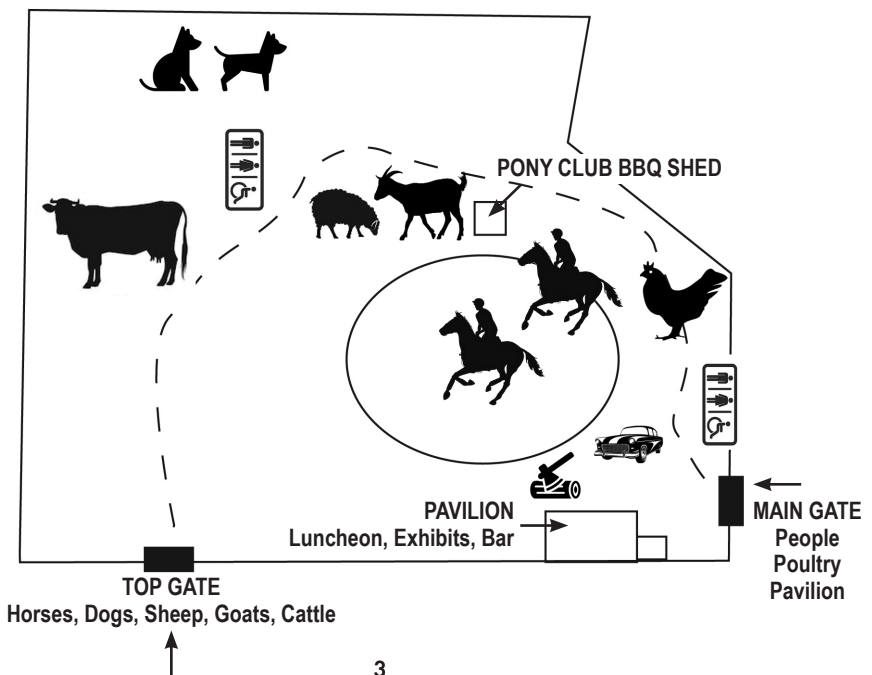

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY FOR SHOW ● The Committee reserves the right to change the program if needed. ● Horses competing must be Registered Australian Stock Horses unless only ridden by a child under 13 years of age. ● The owner must be a Financial Member of the Society. ● Proof of registration and current membership card must be produced on day of competition. ● All riders must be Financial Members of the Society. ● Temporary Day Membership may be applied for on the day. A \$20 fee will apply. ● Entry in the draft requires participation in all other challenge events. ● All riders 13 years and over must be mounted on Registered Australian Stock Horses. ● All riders under 18 years must wear an ASA approved helmet when riding or handling horses. ● Under no circumstances are stallions to be handled or ridden by any person under 18 years. ● A novice rider is a rider who has never won first prize in the same type of event (except youth or consolation classes) at any show or event. ● The rider / handler are responsible for the control of the horse at all times. ● The rider / handler agrees to abide by the Rules and Regulations as well as the code of conduct of the Society, and acknowledges that the Society assumes no responsibility for accidents incurred to horses, riders or handlers during the event. ● Any competitor or exhibitor may lodge a complaint in writing to the secretary of the show committee within 30 minutes of the completion of an event. This must be accompanied with a deposit of \$50 which may not be refunded if the complaint proves frivolous.

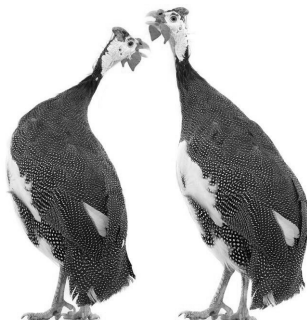

The Society will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused by another exhibit and will not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss or misdelivery of livestock or exhibit of any kind or for any damages done thereto and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Society indemnified against any legal proceedings from any accident, loss or damage.
12. Exhibits must not be removed without the permission of the section steward. Livestock may be removed at 4pm - Pavilion exhibits at 4pm on Saturday. Any exhibitor failing to comply with this regulation will be liable to a penalty of \$2 and may be debarred from entering the following year.
13. All persons exhibiting must accept the decision of the judges appointed by the Society and on all protests, the decision of the Protest Committee shall be final and without appeal. Any person or persons interfering with a judge, steward or official of the Society, or any exhibitor refusing in any way to carry out the instruction of a steward, shall be liable at the discretion of the Society to a penalty not exceeding \$20 and, together with his or her exhibit or exhibits, may be disqualified from exhibiting for any period, or may be expelled from the showground.
14. Any exhibitor shall, if required, furnish a statutory declaration as to the correctness of his or her particulars of entry and any exhibitor proved to have knowingly made false entries for any prize, or to have willfully infringed any of the rules or regulations of the Society, shall be subject to the following penalties - forfeiture of all entrance fees or prizes, non-permission to exhibit again, expulsion from the Society.

EXHIBITOR'S RULES

15. Two exhibits by separate owners must be entered in anyone event, or no award will be made, except in cases where the judge considers the exhibit worthy.

16. All persons who, after entering exhibits, especially livestock, are unable through unforeseen circumstances to exhibit same, will be expected to give notice to the Secretary or Chief Steward of that section, of their inability to make arrangements to compete.

17. PROTESTS:

- All protests must be delivered to the Secretary in writing within one hour of the event being judged on the day of the show, accompanied by a fee of \$50, which will be forfeited if the protest is deemed frivolous.

- In ring events (horses), a protest must be made within half an hour after the event. It shall be the duty of the person protesting to produce evidence in support of his/her allegation. The Society Protest Committee shall consist of the President, two Vice Presidents and Immediate Past President.

- Should it be impossible for two Vice Presidents and Immediate Past President to attend, the President has the power to co-opt three members of the Committee.

- If any doubt arises or any protest is entered against the correctness of any entry, the Committee shall demand a Statutory Declaration and/or shall call upon the person or persons lodging the protest and shall take evidence regarding the question in dispute. The decision of the Committee will be final. Any exhibitor having made a false entry, shall be subject to all or one of the following penalties, viz - forfeiture of prizes, non-permission to exhibit again, expulsion from the Society.

18. Nothing to indicate the ownership of exhibits will be permitted except brands of livestock and where specified in the schedule.

19. Application for passes must be made to the Secretary prior to the show.

20. A general parade may be held on the day of the Show, depending on time and space available for such parade, in which all leadable livestock exhibited in the show must take part. Only prizes won at **this show may be worn in the general parade.**

21. No exhibitor of livestock shall be permitted to use any pen or stall other than those allotted to them by the stewards.

22. Any exhibit suffering from an infectious or contagious disease shall be removed from the ground immediately if

ordered to do so by the steward. Should the owner not carry out the direction of the steward, the steward is empowered to remove the exhibit at the owner's expense and no liability may be attached to the Society in any way.

23. The Committee has the power to reject any entry without showing cause.

24. JUDGES:

- Judges shall be appointed by the Chief Steward of each section and their duties shall be to award prizes to the various classes which have been assigned to their judging.

- Judges will receive entry books from the steward of the section and as they arrive at their decision, will write their award with any remarks they may desire, in the entry book.

- Judges shall disqualify any exhibits which in their opinion do not comply with the regulations and will not award prizes in any class in which the exhibits are not considered, in their opinion, to possess sufficient merit and shall enter the reasons in their entry book.

- Judges will sign the award books and deliver them to the stewards of the section.

- Judges shall not go into the vicinity of any class or exhibit which it is their province to judge, until invited by the steward of that class and, without inquiry as to the ownership, they shall determine the order or merit by the number affixed to the exhibit.

- Every award shall be made at the time of judging and, when returned to the Secretary, shall be conclusive, provided no protest is lodged with that official as provided in General Regulation No. 17.

- No one shall act as judge in any class in which he/she may be an exhibitor.

- Judges may, in addition to awarding First and Second prizes, award Very Highly Commended, Highly Commended or Commended to exhibits which they consider worthy.

INFORMATION FOR STALL HOLDERS

1. All commercial ventures at the Show will be positioned at the discretion of the Ground Steward.

2. All Stall holders will provide their own tables, chairs, shelters.

3. All commercial food stalls will be positioned outside the Pavilion.
